NEW LAWS, VETOED BILLS

These bills were among the 90 awaiting the governor's signature or veto by the end of the day Monday.

BILLS SIGNED INTO LAW

Weapons: Under AB 2580, state authorities must annually inspect the places where dangerous weapons are supposed to be to ensure that rockets, machine guns, mortars, heavy artillery, cannons and other weapons have not fallen into the wrong hands. Since 1967, the U.S. Attorney General's Office has issued about 900 permits to about 300 individuals who possess more than 20,000 firearms and other dangerous weapons. What has happened to all those weapons, no one can say with certainty. "Two, five, 10 years later, nobody's checked," said the bill's author, Assemblyman Joe Simitian, D-Palo Alto. Many of the permits are held by motion picture studios, which use the weapons as props in movies and TV shows.
